RECOMMENDED EATERIES

There is a wonderful range of fantastic places to eat within easy reach of Bovisand and part of the fun is finding your own favourites. Here's a small selection to get you started in rough order of proximity to the Park: bon appetit!

Deliveries/Walking distance

Just Eat

List 40+ options from a wide variety of cuisines. Koishii Japanese restaurant is a favourite of ours.

Good to know: Worth checking the minimum order value and delivery cost before you order. Most are very reasonable. Check they know exactly where they are delivering to as some get us confused with Bovisand Lodge Holiday Park which is a 12 minute drive away. Our Park gates close at 7.30pm (or 5.30pm in the Winter months) so orders arriving later than this will need to be met at the gates.

Cafe Bovisands

Situated within the Park and has wonderful views. Has takeaway food, or you can eat indoors or outdoors on their new decking area. Includes a small shop where you can purchase beach equipment. Best for breakfasts, panini, cake, coffees and Sunday Roast Dinners.

The Mussel Inn, Down Thomas PL9 0AQ

Small gastro pub. Not cheap but usually good value. Veggie options. Use local sources for food and drinks. Wide selection of gins. Dog friendly. Very popular Sunday lunch and Saturday breakfast. Log fire. Beer garden.

Good to know: 15 minutes walk up a steep hill. The shortest route is to take the footpath sign indicated by the beside chalet number 59. Follow the rough path, known locally as Seaweed Lane, (shaded, lots of wildflowers) until you meet a tarmac road. Turn right and follow this road (when you see the 20 mph signs you have reached the top) until you reach Down Thomas village shop. The pub is just across the road. It takes 6 minutes to drive.

The Cliff Edge Cafe. Fort Bovisand. PL9 9AD

Delicious, hearty portions of homemade food with a sprinkle of imagination eg halloumi and rose harissa toasted sandwich, cheese tea, fabulous views. Locally sourced food. Dog friendly. Lots of outside seats. Tea served from their collection of novelty teapots.

Good to know: It's the small blue building to the right of Fort Bovisand and the two larger buildings. To walk, go out of the Park gates, down the footpath past the public beach and up the steps on the other side of the beach. The steps are steep, and irregular so require care. If you prefer a gentler and more shaded ascent turn right at the bottom of the steps to walk

alongside the caravan park. When you reach a tarmac road turn sharp left, almost doubling back on yourself, along the entrance road to the caravan park. This is a lot further than climbing the steps, but it is easier. You will emerge with the cafe facing you across a car park. It takes around 12 minutes to drive there.

The Eddystone Inn, Heybrook Drive, Heybrook Bay. PL9 0BN

Large gastro pub with bar area, 50-seat restaurant and several terraces that have amazing views towards the Eddystone lighthouse. Breakfasts, Sunday lunches and Takeaways. Locally sourced ingredients. Dog friendly. Log fire.

Good to know: It's a beautiful walk that takes a smidge under half an hour. You have a choice of taking the coastal path south to Heybrook Bay then turn left uphill along Heybrook Drive for a couple of minutes or walking up to Down Thomas, turning right at the Mussel Inn to follow Renney Road and then take Heybrook Drive to the pub. The coastal path gets very close to the cliff edge which is not safe if it is dark, or you have had a few drinks. The route along Renney Road to Down Thomas has great views down the Western Approaches to south Cornwall. Takes around 10 minutes to drive there.

The Odd Wheel, Knighton Road, Wembury, Devon. PL9 0JD

Proper village pub. Aiming for good quality staples like roasts on Sunday as well as something a little different. Some interesting veggie food. Bar with fire and juke box, restaurant and beer garden. Dog friendly.

Good to know: 20 minute walk to Wembury beach from the pub or takes 5 minutes to drive there from the pub. The most direct route to walk to the Odd Wheel takes around an hour from Bovisand.
